- 2 – Listen Humbly
- 3 – Speak the truth in love
- 4 – Address the issue while edifying the person
- 5 – Keep Current

3 Steps in Biblical Change

- 1 – Put Off the sinful behavior

Actions

Attitudes

- 2 – Be renewed in your mind

Do not skip this step!

Your values will come through in these interactions.

Are you valuing a virtue of Christ or are you valuing a fleshly desire?
Common Fleshly desires that pop up in parenting

Embarrassment over child's behavior

Desiring for your child to be liked (sneaky flesh move
from desire for your child to be a blessing)

Frustration over changes in schedule

Of others opinions

Infant/Toddler – elevate truth, not consequence

PARENTING PRINCIPLES

The Principle of _____

“I have taught thee . . . I have led thee”

Instead of denying weaknesses and struggles, allow the change that the Holy Spirit leads you through to be a path for them to follow.

Depending on your make-up and your child’s, you may need to work on “display” mode for your attitudes.

Question them and encourage questions from them.

The Principle of _____

“way of wisdom” “take fast hold of instruction”

Celebrate the virtues of Christ and rehearse the joys of truth

Help your child identify the virtue in Christ and why it is important to them and you – i.e., why you value it!

Don’t ignore feelings, but understand what feelings are and explain them to your child

*Feelings

Feelings are indicators

What we value

What we worship

i.e., What controls us

Feelings must be addressed by gospel truth! (We must teach our children that behavior is a function of our decisions, not our conditions.)

Notice how Solomon consistently clarifies:

Instruction/expectation

DO NOT LECTURE

“Pack a phrase” for each virtue and use it often

Consequence

Of choosing correctly

Of choosing incorrectly

**Practical application*

Make sure there are “degrees” on both sides of the spectrum

Do not “surprise” your child with reactive discipline

You have the right to change the parameters and redefine them if inadequate

We must realize that every decision takes us toward or away from our stated goals. We either train proactively or reactively – but we train ALL the time because our children are always in learning mode.

We must learn to ask ourselves, “What virtue does this activity/decision elevate?”

Putting It Together

Understanding your child’s path

Decisions are always made in one of two directions.

“Two choices on the shelf, pleasing _____ or pleasing _____.”

Children often fall into a particular style of decision-making:

Thinker – dominos inside of head, all of them have to fall before they respond

“You must _____ now.”

Feeler – relationship-oriented, but can’t decide

Children will have options/maybe try to “gift” you instead of obeying.

“You must control emotions and obey now!”

Doer – dozen projects going, lots of ideas going on
