("Hidden Worldviews" - Wilkins and Sanford)

Utilitarian vs Expressive

Identity is conflated with material possessions

National identity is at the center of identity and morality.

Narratives are promoted that promote and narratives that detract are ignored or lessened.

There is not a universal standard of right and wrong unless commonly believed and accepted.

Scientific Naturalism

Only material phenomena are real, dismissing spiritual or supernatural

Eclectic mix of spiritual beliefs emphasizing personal enlightenment and self-deification

Reliance on therapy as a means to achieve personal fulfillment
